From Columbus:

Take Interstate 70 East to St. Rt. 13 South. Follow St. Rt. 13 until you come to St. Rt. 204, turn left. Approximately 6 miles. Turn right on to OH 757. Follow OH 757 to the Glenford Fort Parking lot on the left.



The Glenford Stone Fort, an ancient Adena

-Hopewell hilltop enclosure, dated to 270
BCE, was utilized for ceremonial purposes.
The "fort" which is open to the public on a limited basis, offers pleasure for everyone from the archaeologist to the nature enthusiast!

Glenford Fort is a name not yet recognized by most Ohioans, but that is about to change! A partnership has formed to raise the public consciousness of this ancient Adena-Hopewell ceremonial site AND to save a critical 65 acre portion of the complex. The substantial remainder of Glenford Fort is located on private land owned by the Cooperrider Family.
