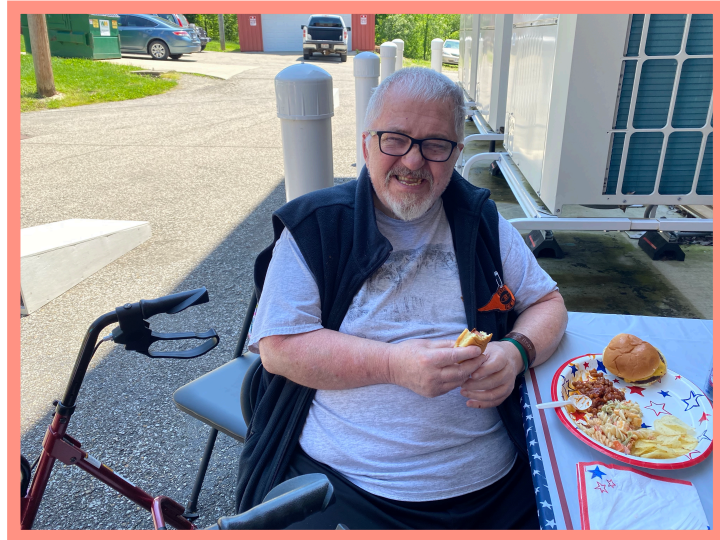

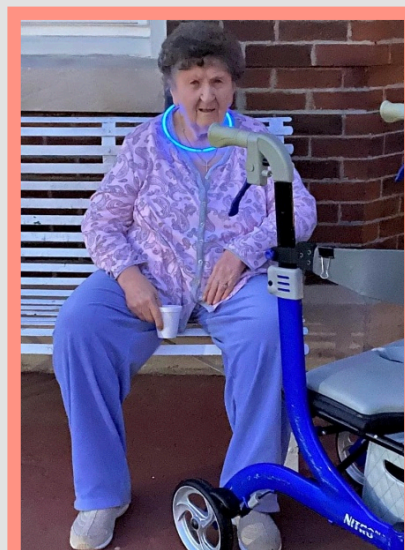


# Father's Day

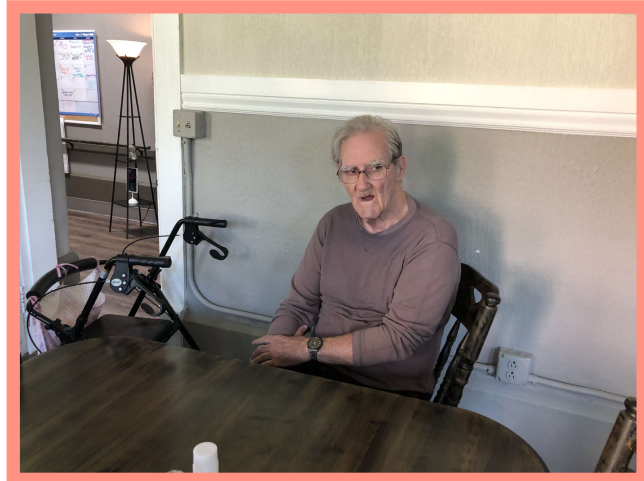
## July 4th
